Imbedded in Family Support Line's *Guiding Philosophy* is our goal to 'ensure high quality, professional service provision to children, families, professionals and community members'.

Remaining true to this goal, living up to the image, requires dedication and commitment at all levels. This year was no exception. The board, staff and our ever supportive donors and volunteers worked diligently to make this happen.

The board's leadership resonated throughout Family Support Line as they worked to provide the foundation by which quality programs and services were delivered. The board began the year with a retreat that focused on 'Mission-Driven Governance'.

A newly developed Communications Committee audited our marketing materials, launched an e-newsletter, created a Facebook page, fashioned a Causes page, and began the process to redevelop our website to better meet the needs of constituents.

The better part of 'ensuring high quality' lies with our staff. These are the people who interact with our clients on a regular basis.

Again this year, 94 to 100% of participants in our group treatment service rated their group leaders at the highest possible level. Members especially recognized these leaders for their support, for maintaining confidentiality and for providing safety in the group setting.

Therapists and behavioral health practitioners attending our *Professional Training Programs* made special note of the level of expertise maintained by our staff. One participant shared, "The experienced instructors were a great resource for information and feedback. In addition to current theory, I learned many practical interventions to use with my clients during therapy sessions."

Making it possible for our board and staff to 'ensure quality services', are the wonderful volunteers and donors who support Family Support Line on a regular basis.

This year, the Bids for Kids committee's hard work paid off as they accomplished their goal of increasing support over the previous year.

Several community groups and clubs provided donations to Family

Support Line by hosting their own fundraising events. A group of Middle School girls created blue wristbands bearing the *Prevent Child Abuse/Stand for Children* message. They helped to spread the word to more than 1,000 people. Additionally, many donors increased their contributions to become a part of our Leadership Circle giving club.

Together, the leadership of the board, the expertise of the staff and the generosity of our volunteers and donors made it possible to meet the many needs of a vulnerable population of children and families. 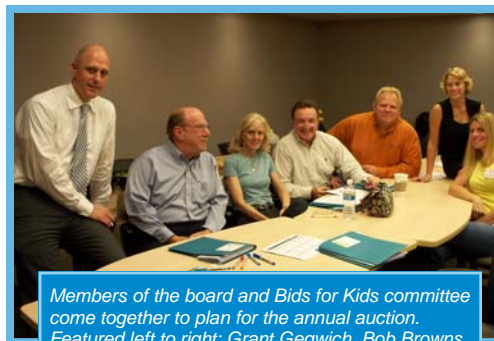

Teacher + Mandated Reporter Training = A+

Did you know? Teachers and others who work with children are required by law to report suspected child abuse.

There are no gray areas when it comes to reporting child abuse. The ramifications can be devastating to the child and to future victims.

It is imperative that teachers and others who work with children know and understand the law and feel capable to carry out this mandate. However, knowing when and how to report such abuse is not an easy task.

Educating teachers has been a component of Family Support Line's programs since the early 1990's. Thousands have participated in the "Recognizing and Responding to Child Abuse Program".

The training explains the specifics of the laws, creates awareness of the types of child abuse, helps teachers recognize troublesome behaviors and know how best to handle a disclosure.

Teachers who participated this past year made the grade! 93% to 96% reported a significant increase in

their knowledge of the signs of abuse, offenders, how to handle a disclosure and their responsibilities under the law.

Participants commented that the program was, "well presented and approachable", "eye opening", and "extremely powerful".

To better understand this difficult issue and to respond, teachers are asking for "more time", "more information", "more scenarios" and "more discussion". They have a specific interest in understanding the sexuality of young children and knowing what to expect so that they can better identify potential abuse.

A Safe and Supportive Community

Family Support Line's **Community Group Program** helps victims of sexual abuse and their families recover in a community of support.

Professionally-lead treatment groups for each young children, tweens, teens, parents and siblings provide peer support in a caring and safe community.

Groups are constantly changing to better meet the needs of clients. Recently we added a new event to extend the sense of community.

Called our 'Group of Groups', on the last evening of each of the 14-week sessions, the groups come together to collectively share their experiences and what they have learned.

Members perform skits, sing songs and share poems that they have written. Presentations give participants the opportunity to tell their stories in a different way and with those with whom they feel safe.

Some share openly about their abuse or what they would like to say to their perpetrator. Others share experiences with building friendships or feeling better about themselves after their abuse.

Presentations receive wonderful praise as members listen to the powerful stories shared by their fellow group members. By sharing in this way members feel more connected and supported, two important ingredients in the recipe for healing.

Building Professional Skills

This year's 'Treating Child Sexual Abuse: Opening Pandora's Box' conference focused on the relationship between trauma and the brain. Presented by Dr. Jonathan Baylin, this cutting edge research is opening new insights for treatment professionals especially for those working in the field of child sexual abuse.

The conference highlighted the brains response to extreme stress and trauma. Participants learned why some people are more emotionally resilient, including how genes and experience contribute to coping skills. Most importantly, participants learned how treatment can help the brain to heal from traumatic experiences like child sexual abuse.

Family Support Line also offers a 'Child Sexual Abuse Treatment Certificate' for professionals. Program participants have the option of attending individual sessions or completing the full 36 CEC's to receive the 'certificate of completion'.

More than 10,000 reached!

In 2009-2010:

- 6,030 children, 147 parents and 312 teachers participated in a Prevention Education seminar.
- 3,251 parents received a 'Parents Are Key' packet to help them better discuss personal safety with their child.
- 32 children and parents received 588 hours of specialized treatment through Therapy Network. More than 85% received these services free or at a reduced rate.
- 43 children and 34 parents participated in our Community Group treatment programs.
- 37 clients received services through the PATH, Co-Parenting and Life Skills programs.
- 156 therapists and behavioral health professionals participated in a Professional Training seminar.

of physical abuse?

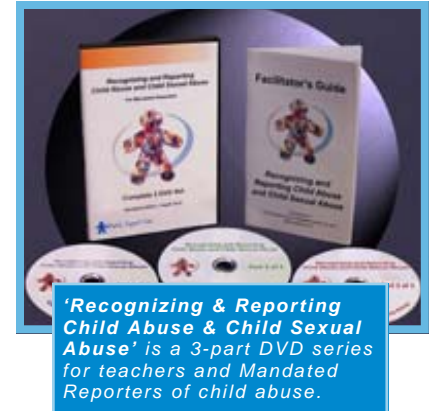
- Can you tell when a child may be a victim of sexual abuse?

Remembering Linda Smith

Longtime Family Support Line board member, staff member, volunteer and all around supporter, Linda Smith, passed away on July 12, 2008 after a long illness.

To say that Linda had a history with Family Support Line would be an understatement. Linda was a pioneer in the field of child sexual abuse and was involved in starting what we know today as Family Support Line. Linda was especially instrumental in formulating the holistic approach that has been Family Support Line's hallmark.

In beginning, Linda joined with other professionals volunteering her time to provide treatment to children and families. Specifically, she led the groups for non-offending parents and for sexual abuse offenders. When Family Support Line incorporated in 1988, Linda served on the original Board of Directors. She conducted many of our Prevention Education programs throughout the years.

It would be difficult to even begin to recount all the families who were helped by Linda. It would include nearly all of our clients. Everything about Linda was about being an advocate.

Education and Training Director, Mary Hove, co-lead the non-offending parents group with Linda. Mary shares, *"It was obvious that Linda had a list running in her head about what could be done for this problem or that. She had resource to offer to help with daily living, contacts for jobs, help with home repairs, clothes, emergency money – you name it, Linda would have an idea or find a resource."*

Executive Director Pat Kosinski recalls, *"For me, Linda will always be the quintessential Social Worker. She truly understood the idea of 'person in*

environment'. She knew systems and how to work them. From Linda I learned how to maneuver and manipulate to get things for my clients. And, I learned the value of a thank you gift."

In 2002, Linda 'retired' from being a group leader to pursue another educational goal – a graduate degree in law, which she completed in 2006. She wanted to learn more ways that she could be an advocate for others in need.

Linda continued to support the organization as a volunteer. Each Christmas she organized her colleagues at Delaware County Memorial Hospital to support our children and families. Linda and her friends provided some of the most generous gifts.

After her death, Linda's colleagues created the 'Friends of Linda Smith', a bequest given in Linda's memory. Continuing what Linda started, they now raise funds for and provide donations to those in need at Family Support Line.

Linda was a self made woman who raised her three children as a single parent. She had a love of life and loved the people she touched. She was a life-long learner, she never gave up and she kept her passion going despite overwhelming obstacles.

Linda left her passion behind for us. She will be sorely missed but her legacy with Family Support Line continues through her friends and family. Linda's son, Kevin, currently serves as the Treasurer for the Family Support Line Board of Directors.

Family Support Line created **The Linda Smith Memorial Award** to honor Linda's extraordinary spirit. The award recognizes someone who has served as Linda did as a board member, a staff member or a

volunteer, and who is dedicated to the cause in an exceptional way.

Recipients of the inaugural **Linda Smith Memorial Award** included Sherry Hall and Eileen Young. Both Sherry and Eileen have given generously of their time and resources to further our mission. We are grateful that Sherry and Eileen carry on the important work that Linda Smith started so many years ago.
